
Therefore, CSC 495 will include an ethics component.

Lecture

For each chapter:

- I'll read the chapter. Take some notes. Then distribute them to the students.
- You read the chapter. Take some notes. Bring them to lecture.
- In lecture, we'll have a class discussion on the interesting parts of the chapter.
- In my notes, I'll recommend a discussion question or two as a possible topic for one of your ethics papers.

Ethics Paper Requirements

Each student is responsible for writing 3 ethics-related papers that are worth 15% of your final grade, 5% each. Details:

- → Your paper will usually be 2-3 pages long.
- → Formatting: 12 point font, 1.5 to double-spaced, page numbers at the bottom of each page
- → Please cite at least 2 (worthy) sources other than the textbook or Wikipedia.
- → Use the "citation-sequence" format (reference list is in the order in which they are cited in your paper)
- → Use Council of Science Editors (CSE) style for in-text citations and bibliography. Here's some online help:
 - writing.wisc.edu/Handbook/DocCSE.html U of Wisconsin "Council of Science Editors Documentation Style" review

I like our book's citation and bibliography style.

Here's an example of an inline citation, you can use the superscript or brackets, []:

Traumatic life events and posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) are endemic among American civilians [1].

And a bibliography entry for that citation:

1. Betty Friedan, *The Feminine Mystique*, W. W. Norton, 1963, p. 312.

Ethics Paper Assignments

There are three assignments this term. Go!

Ethics Paper #1

Description: Write an Op-ed piece: Apple v. The Feds

Due: Wed Mar 30 at noon (start of class)

Grading: This paper is worth 5 points, or 5% of your final grade

Please write an op-ed piece explaining your support for either Apple or the United States government in the case of unlocking the San Bernardino terrorist's iPhone.

What's an op-ed piece?

The NY Times says: "Articles typically run from 400 to 1,200 words" (link). The Wall Street Journal says: "Op-Eds: 600-1200 words, double-spaced. The piece must center on a strong argument about an issue in the news and not be a response to a Journal article. Please use jargon-free language." (link)

I'll probably ask for a printout and electronic version. Stay tuned.

Ethics Paper #2

Description: Write an ethics paper on a topic covered in Chapters 1-3 of our text. Please follow the guidelines above. This is **not** an op-ed like we did in paper #1. Rather, this paper is a more formal, sourced exposition.

Due: Wed Apr 27, 2016 (week 5)

Grading: This paper is worth 5 points, or 5% of your final grade

My recommended discussion questions/topics are:

- [p 43] Class Discussion Exercise 1.34 The Encyclopedia Britannica... discuss the impact of physical (paper) versus electronic (computer memory) storage of knowledge/information.
- [p 43] Class Discussion Exercise 1.35 Social bots... consider the ethics of social bots.
- [p 124] Class Discussion Exercise 2.49 Your town is considering setting up a camera and face recognition system... discuss the ethics of surveillance using facial recognition systems.
- [p 124] Class Discussion Exercise 2.51 Veterinarians implant computer chips into pets... discuss the ethics of chip implants for people (not just children).
- [p 175] Class Discussion Exercise 3.36 Setting up a website with information about suicide... discuss the ethics of the distribution of controversial information.
- [p 175] Class Discussion Exercise 3.38 Is the control that Google (and other large tech companies) have over the internets a threat to freedom of speech? How the power of a large company compare to that of a government?

Ethics Paper #3

Description: Write an ethics paper on a topic covered in Chapters 4, 6, or 9 of our text.

Please follow the guidelines above.

Due: Wed Jun 1, 2016 (week 10)

Grading: This paper is worth 5 points, or 5% of your final grade

My recommended discussion questions/topics are:

- 4.43 How will both copyright laws and future technology be used to protect intellectual property?
- 4.45 Should software be copyrightable? What would the impact be if it were not?
- 6.30 What if other nations don't share America's rules on employee health and safety?
- 6.33 Automated interviewing. What do you think?
- 6.34 Women in CS. What do you think? As a contrast, what percentage of elementary school teachers are men? Nurses? If this gender differential a problem? What percentage of college students are female? What is the trend?
- 9.40 Is it ethical to work on SkyNet? More generally, what part do ethics play in researching topics that may tap incredible power... for good or evil.
