Some details on your paper:

- The whole description should be brief, 1-2 pages. Please use the past tense to describe anything related to 2016. It's 2023 now, eh.
- Describe your idea/product that got you start, and then how things went over the course of 7 years. Feel free to flex your creative muscles here.
- After that description, please include at least 5 references you found (and liked) that helped your career. These can be websites, books, blog posts, people, etc.
- **Team option!** If you can glom a team of 3 or more 495-ers together, then your essay is still only 1-2 pages, and you only need 10 references for your entire team. That's win-win!
- At the top of the first page, include your name(s) in the upper right corner. Just
 use your first name and last initial (Bill K) because I'd like to post these on the
 website. If you're a team, please sort your references by team member.
- During our Final Exam class period, you'll discuss your ideas, your success stories, and references with the group.
